"A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him— the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD— and he will delight in the fear of the LORD." Isaiah 11: 1-3

On Christmas we celebrate the coming of Jesus into the world as a human- the incarnation of God. Isaiah 11 foretells this and connects Jesus to Jesse. Jesse was the father of King David, and Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family tree.

We all have a family tree—branches filled with mothers, fathers, sisters, brothers, grandparents, aunts, and uncles. Some of us know our tree back through a thousand years or more. Some of us only know a few generations. Some of us are adopted and don't know our tree. No matter what our personal tree looks like, in baptism we are claimed by God and become part of God's family tree.

The Jesse Tree is a way we remember God's family line and our own place in it. Isaiah talked about the connection from Jesse to Jesus, but the tree goes back farther- all the way to the beginning in the Garden of Eden.

The Jesse Tree is a way of telling the story of God's plan from the beginning of time to save us through Jesus- by becoming human. It follows the lineage of Christ's family and key people in the Old Testament that God uses to tell the story from Creation, culminating in Jesus becoming human. It is a countdown daily to Christmas with the telling of a story, and an ornament that acts as a symbol and visual reminder of the story.

Some of our ancestors had this tradition. Jesse trees became popular in the Middle Ages as a way to tell the story of Christ and to connect us all through seeing and hearing of the story. They sometimes weren't actually trees but other forms of art, like stained-glass windows in churches, tapestries, and carvings. By participating in the Jesse tree, we are connected to all of those who have gone before us in faith.

If you have not received a Jesse tree packet, please pick one up at the church or let us know if you need one. I pray that this advent we are all connected in faith.

What is a Jesse Tree?

A Jesse Tree represents the family tree of Jesus Christ. Each ornament represents a story from the Bible that tells about God's people before Jesus was born. The tradition of the Jesse Tree dates back to the middle ages. The name "Jesse Tree" comes from Isaiah 11:1, "Then a shoot will spring from the stem of Jesse, and a branch from his roots will bear fruit." Jesse is the father of King David. The savior was to come from David's family. During the Advent season, a Bible Story is read which relates to Jesus family or God's people. After the Bible story is read and prayer, an ornament is placed on a tree – the Jesse Tree.

This year there is a packet for each family to start their Jesse tree on December 1.

On December 21 at 6:00 pm, we will have a Blue Christmas Service

Blue Christmas (also called the Longest Night) is a day in the Advent season marking the longest night of the year.

Many of us are acquainted with the paradox of the Advent and Christmas seasons – a time when we feel we are supposed to celebrate hope, love, joy and peace, and yet a time that can also be full of depression, sadness and grief.

Blue Christmas services offer special recognition of the struggles that many people face during this season. It acknowledges the struggles that we all face while providing a safe place of rest, comfort and healing, with the assurance that Christ, the light of the world, is coming.

Raise the Roof!

The last roof was put on around 1993. The current roof can be maintained through the coming winter until a new roof can be installed in 2024, but a delay beyond next year is not possible.

The best and most cost effective of the bids received for another 30 year roof has a price tag of approximately \$100,000.

Donations amounting to \$49,000.00 have been received to date; we are deeply grateful for your generous gifts! This year our Sunday School will be collecting funds for the new roof through the offerings they receive, and a display in the Narthex will track our overall progress toward our fund-raising goal. We are asking that you prayerfully consider how you can contribute to this project so that we can receive the additional \$60,000.00 that is needed to defray the cost of the new roof. The people of Holy Trinity have always responded faithfully to the needs of the congregation, and we are confident that you will once again give generously to this appeal.


