The following 2024 Budget was developed by the Finance Committee and approved by Church Council. This budget will be presented at the Congregational Meeting in January 2024 for approval by the Congregation. In summary there is a 6.6% overall increase versus the 2023 budget. Primary increases are seen in salaries, benefits, tax and fellowship (150th Celebration) while a reduction was seen in administrative expenses. Synod Benevolence was increased to represent historical rates.
