Council Briefs, September 11, 2024

Reports of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer

Reports provided. The Roof is paid off. It was noted that both the front porch and the organ need to be replaced. The estimate for the front porch is ~\$83k. The estimate for a new organ is ~\$100k. Jerry Kuhn made a motion to revise the green "ROOF Fund" envelopes to "Organ Fund" and transfer existing Roof funds to the new "Organ Fund."

Youth Ministry

 Zoom meetings with youth once a month. Will also pursue service-related activities for youth.

Property Committee

- Motion made and passed to propose a plan for redecorating the walls of the Miller Parlor and uncluttering the room.
- Motion made and passed to accept the proposal of Bill Thomas' Painting & Staining to reapply missing vinyl strips to the affected Educational Building awning windows, at a cost of \$1500.
- Motion made and passed to accept the proposal of Premier Concrete Concepts, Inc. to perform the concrete repair and replacement of the front porch and stairway of the Educational Building.

Motion made and accepted to accept the proposal of Bella Railings to install new powder coated aluminum railings to the porch, steps, and ramp of the church's Educational Building, at a cost of \$36,321.


